



BEING A SAFE PEDESTRIAN – HANDS ARE FOR HOLDING

Discussion questions:

- Why are the children holding an adult's hand? Whose hand do you hold when you go walking?
- Where else do you need to hold an adult's hand to stay safe?
In a car park, crossing a road, crossing at the traffic lights or crosswalk.
- What can you do if an adult can't hold your hand?
Hold onto their clothes or arm, pram, shopping trolley or bag.
- Why are they stopped at the edge of the driveway?
- The people in the car park – What do you think they are looking out for, and, why are they holding hands?

Key messages:

- **Always hold the hand of a trusted adult** or hold their clothes, a bag, or side of a pram or wheelchair, when they are in the traffic environments.
- **Share pathways** with others by keeping left.

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
