



BEING A SAFE PEDESTRIAN – THE SAFETY SPOT

Discussion questions:

- Where are the children standing to wave goodbye?
- Why is this a safe place to stand while cars are going in and out of the driveway?
- Is the driveway a safe place to play?
- Why should you never leave your toys in the driveway?
- Do you have a 'safety spot' to stand on when a car is leaving your house? Where is it?

Key messages:

- **Use the safety spot** when cars are moving in and out of driveways. The safety spot is a place where children stand away from the car, so that drivers can see them.

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
