

Becoming work ready Applying for a job

Applying for jobs can be daunting, particularly for a young person wanting to enter the world of work for the first time.

Jobs are advertised by an organisation looking for the best applicant to fill a role. So that an organisation can judge the best applicant, there are expectations placed on young people to:

- · interact positively, honestly and respectfully with others
- demonstrate their skills, strengths and potential to develop
- show an understanding of the role, the organisation and how it benefits society
- understand their rights and responsibilities as an employee.

Being informed about the recruitment process, people and technology can help a young person set themselves apart from other applicants and win the job.

Key elements of job applications are a resume or Curriculum Vitae (CV) and cover letter. Most employers require a job application form to be completed, either on paper or in an ATS. Sometimes selection criteria are to be addressed. Confirm two referees to use on request.
