



School-based Apprenticeship and Traineeship Support Scheme



Funding is now available to assist public school students undertaking a school-based apprenticeship or traineeship.

School staff and students can apply for up to \$1,000 funding per student to provide targeted support. School-based apprenticeships and traineeships (SBATs) are paid, employment-based training programs for full-time school students, who are generally 15 years and older. They provide a nationally recognised VET qualification, experience in the workplace, and an understanding of the industry and employment opportunities available.

What is the SBAT Support Scheme?

The SBAT Support Scheme provides funding to assist public school students identified as vulnerable and at risk of not completing their training and qualifications.

SBAT student funding can be used to access:

- protective personal equipment, such as boots and safety glasses, that meet Australian safety standards
- uniforms or appropriate work attire
- public transport to and from the workplace or training location
- equipment or tools of the trade.

SBAT school funding can be used to help the student access:

- tutoring, mentoring or workplace support
- group student travel.



Is other training eligible for funding support?

Students are also eligible to apply for support if they are at risk of not completing their training while they are:

- enrolled in any training that has a mandated work placement, for example, pre-apprenticeships, skill sets or VET qualifications
- attending a Trade Training Centre outside of their local intake area

How do I apply for SBAT funding support?

Parents or carers are encouraged to contact their child's school if further information is required.
