Learning intention

Students will develop and understanding of the importance of safety in the workplace by completing the WorkSafe SmartMove general module.

Success criteria

Students can:

- identify hazards in the workplace and laws to protect workers
- complete the SmartMove general module.

Classroom organisation

- Whole class

Preparation

- Familiarise yourself with the lesson content and the <u>SmartMove general module study</u> <u>guide</u> to support students.
- Teachers are encouraged to create a SmartMove account and complete the general module to improve their familiarity.
- Print copies of the SmartMove general module worksheet for each student.



Activity 1

- Show students the YouTube video Common unsafe acts in workplace / industry
- After viewing, have a class discussion about the importance of staying safe in the workforce. What are the implications of unsafe practices?
- Explain to students the legal requirements for employers and employees in the workforce taken from the <u>SmartMove general module study guide</u> (page 6): In Western Australia, workplace health and safety (WHS) is regulated by the *Work Health and Safety Act 2020* and the *Work Health and Safety regulations 2022*. These WHS laws cover nearly all workplaces in WA. The 3 most important things you need to be aware of about WHS law are:
 - You have the right to refuse unsafe work.
 - Your employer has responsibilities to provide and maintain a safe workplace.
 - You must take reasonable care of your own safety.
- Have students transfer these 3 key points and the 2 regulations into the worksheet.

Activity 2

The WorkSafe SmartMove Certificate has been developed for students in Years 9 to 12, and for new young workers between the ages of 15 to 21. Students and young workers learn about the potential dangers, rights and responsibilities that exist within the workplace.

- Students should log on SmartMove and create an account. Steps are outlined in the worksheet.
- Complete WorkSafe SmartMove general module. The general module contains background information on WHS, important facts about WHS laws, common workplace hazards found in the workplace and quizzes on the information presented. Interactive activities on two workplace scenarios are available to allow learners apply their knowledge obtained from the learning.
- It is highly likely the general module will not be completed in one lesson. Depending on the learning context this may extend across more lessons or be set for completion at home.

Reflection

- Recap the concept of SAMM which was covered in the general module:
 - 1. Spot the hazard
 - 2. Assess the risk
 - 3. Make the changes
 - 4. Monitor and follow-up.
- Ask students to recall the opening <u>video</u>, and using the SAMM concept, discuss how they could improve 1-2 of the scenarios shown.
- Refer to pages 9-13 of the <u>SmartMove general module study guide</u> for additional information.
